

## Notification of out of hours work – Kensington

In planning for Tomorrow's Sydney we are building a new light rail line to provide modern, reliable and sustainable public transport that will transform services from Circular Quay and the CBD to Kingsford and Randwick via Surry Hills, Moore Park and Kensington.

Standard work hours are Monday to Friday 6am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 5pm. This notification is for approved work that falls outside the standard working hours. This work will be carried out on the below dates and times to minimise disruption to traffic and to maintain the safety of construction work, residents, businesses and the general public.

### Details of work activities

Work will take place **from Thursday 20 April to Saturday 20 May 2017, 8pm to 6am and 8am to 5pm on Sundays**. Out of hours work may continue up to 8am, on both Saturdays and Sundays.

Work will take place at the following locations:

- **Anzac Parade, between Todman Avenue and High Street**

Activities include civil work (excavation, kerb widening), drainage work, geotechnical investigations (potholing and surveying), vegetation work, utility relocations, restoration works, track work (includes rail preparation work, concrete pouring, rail delivery and installation, surveying, welding, saw cutting and surface finishing), heritage work, excavation, compaction of excavation, cable installation, cable connection to substation, operation of lighting towers, removal/installation of light posts, road pavement work, barrier installation, traffic control, traffic signals and signage. This work will take approximately 20 nights within the notified period.

- **Todman Avenue, from the Anzac Parade intersection to Villiers Street, Kensington**

Activities include concrete work, drainage work, geotechnical investigations (potholing and surveying), utility relocations, excavation, compaction of excavation, cable installation, cable connection to substation, operation of lighting towers, temporary restoration of footpath, kerb, gutter, road pavement work, traffic control, local road closures, local footpath diversions, traffic signals and signage. This work will take approximately 20 nights within the notified period.

You may experience some noise and vibration during this work. Where possible, high noise activities such as saw cutting and jackhammering will not take place for more than two consecutive nights. Respite periods will be in place to mitigate impacts to residents during noisy activity.

Equipment and vehicles for this work may include radar detection and survey equipment, concrete trucks and pumps, flood lights, vacuum excavation trucks, coring and drilling machines, excavators, compactors, pick and carry cranes, saw cutters, corers, road grinders, tipper trucks, hand tools, water carts, milling machines, rollers, barriers and traffic control vehicles.

### Traffic and pedestrian changes

Work will involve some lane closures under traffic management. On occasions there will be a full closure of Anzac Parade southbound between Todman Avenue and Doncaster Avenue, between 11pm and 5am only. During these closures, motorists will be detoured onto Doncaster Avenue through Todman Avenue. On some occasions there may also be a full closure of Villiers Street and a detour will be in place.

Traffic control will be in place to direct motorists and pedestrians safely around the operations. Motorists are advised to follow signage and drive to the conditions. Access for emergency services will be maintained at all times.
